
MODELS OF INSTRUCTION ALLOW US TO STRUCTURE OUR CLASS SESSIONS IN A MANNER THAT ENGAGES OUR STUDENTS AND HELPS THEM RETAIN THE INFORMATION WE PRESENT.

A Model of Instruction is a lesson sequence instructors use to structure their classes. These models make lesson design easier and enhance consistency in class structure.

Active Learning Cycle



5E Model

1 Engage

Begin with activities that capture the students' attention, stimulate thinking, and help them access prior knowledge.

2 Explore

Then, have students explore the concept through interactive activities (individual and in groups).

3 Explain

Next, the instructor provides direct instruction on knowledge, skills, and values.

4 Elaborate

After instruction, students apply or extend previously introduced concepts and experiences to new situations.

5 Evaluate

Lastly, students evaluate their learning and prove what they know.

Communicate to your students the purpose of each phase of the instruction model, and help them understand the value for learning.
